THEORIES OF MARITAL AND FAMILY COUNSELING

Apr 28 - Jul 21; Every Monday, 7-10pm

For Year 2 students

This course provides a presentation of the Family from a Biblical perspective, as well as major theoretical underpinnings and clinical practices in the field of marital and family counseling. It includes evolving viewpoints, perspectives, values; the goals of family therapy and key techniques of intervention, emphasizing the growing integrative nature of the current practice of marital and family counseling in the local setting.

Postmodernism has introduced us to the influence of larger systems of beliefs, faiths, and worldviews; and the use of language in how people construct their thinking about reality and the functioning of marital and family life. Special attention, therefore, will be accorded to working with the Asian family in a multicultural, multi-religious setting.


For Year 3 students & Approval by the Dean

THEORIES OF INDIVIDUAL COUNSELING

For Year 1 students

PROFESSIONAL ETHICS

For Year 2 students

This course examines the principles and guidelines for professional counseling practice with regards to confidentiality, professional responsibility, professional relationship boundary, legal issues, including malpractice and other legal liability issues. Students will be facilitated to think through different ethical dilemmas and to employ decision-making strategies in a systematic manner. Special focus will be given to the application of professional ethics within the Church and Christian community, while exploring topics such as dual relationships, leadership boundaries, diversity, reporting processes and confidentiality issues.

FOUNDATION 1: HOW TO READ THE BIBLE

For Year 1 students

The primary objective of this course is to introduce students to the methodological principles for interpreting the Bible in its historical, literary, cultural, and theological context. Students will engage in the hermeneutics of making meaning of scriptural texts, including factors of presuppositions, grammatical relationships, vocabulary, figurative language and genre.

This course is designed with an emphasis on flipped learning. As adult learners, students are expected to have done prior reading and attempted some forum discussions before the onsite classes during which they will practice their interpretive skills and raise questions, while experiencing a fuller and richer appreciation for Bible reading.

COUNSELING CHILDREN

Completed Year 3 and currently in Practicum



This course will introduce the student to basic skills needed for building a therapeutic relationship in counseling children up to 12 years old. It will explore the issues related to childhood development, brain research, normal and deviant behaviors pertaining to this population.

Various strategies and techniques unique to the counseling of this group along with the acquisition of relevant assessment and treatment skills that are clinically based and sensitive to spiritual/religious variables will be covered.
